Summer Forum Series on Disciples Identity Continues Sundays at 11:00 am via Zoom



August 16: Rev. Dr. Dick Hamm

Topic: 2020 Vision for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ): Retrospect and Moving Forward

The Rev. Dr. Dick Hamm served as a minister of Disciples of Christ congregations for 23 years before becoming Regional Minister of Tennessee and then General Minister and President of the denomination, a post he held for 10 years. As General Minister and President, Hamm led the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada in developing 2020 Vision: "to be a faithful, growing church that demonstrates true community, deep Christian spirituality, and a passion for justice." The Vision also calls for the achievement of the following goals by the year 2020: to establish 1,000 new congregations, to revitalize 1,000 congregations, to develop the leaders necessary to make this possible, and to become an anti-racist, pro-reconciling church.

Hamm writes and speaks extensively on the subject of church renewal and has recently retired as a Ministry Partner of The Columbia Partnership, a coaching/consulting organization for church leaders, congregations, and other church organizations. He has also written two books on church renewal: 2020 Vision for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) (Chalice Press, 2001), and Recreating the Church: Leadership for the Post-Modern Age (Chalice Press, 2007). The former, inspiring the topic for this summer forum!
